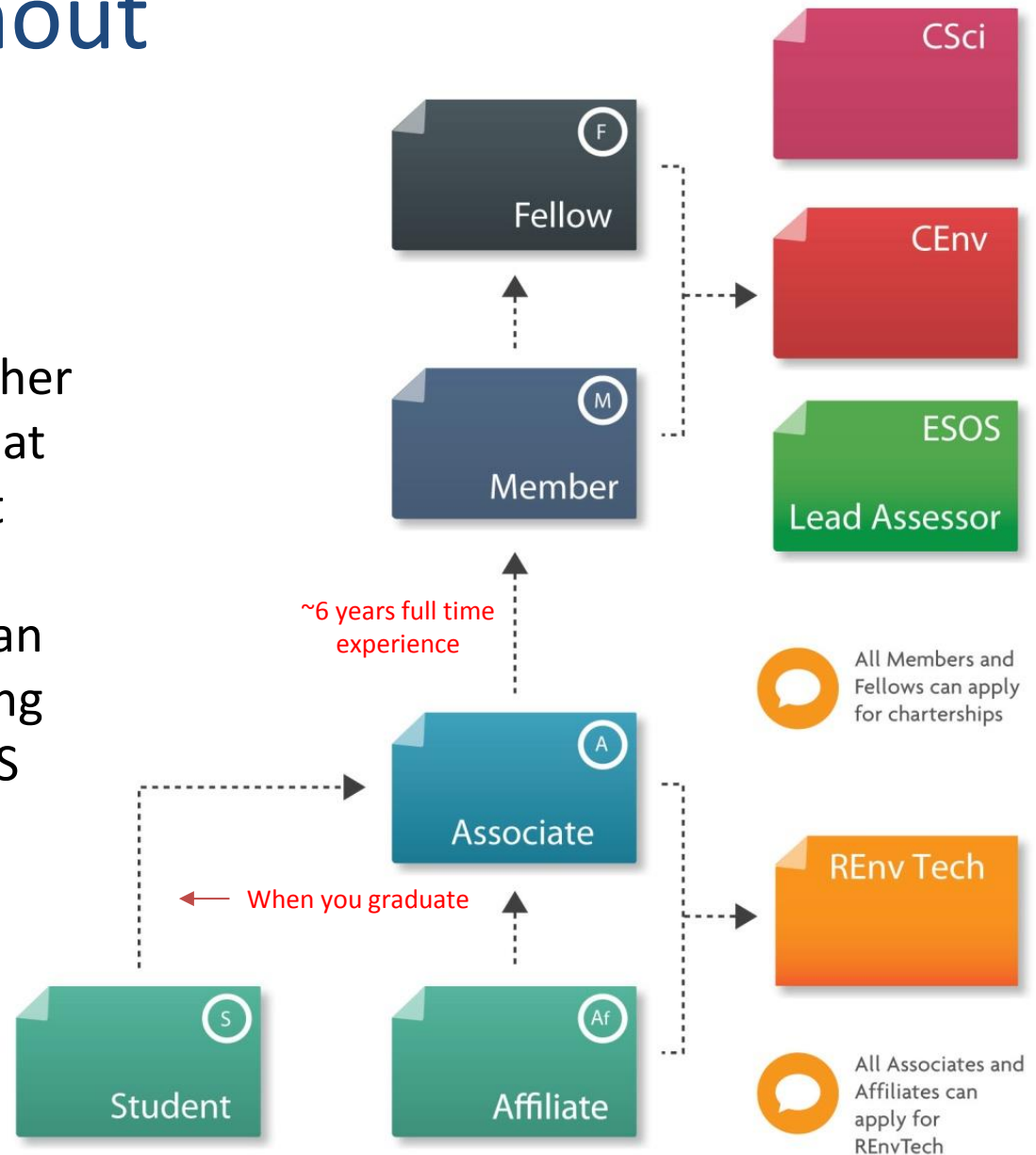

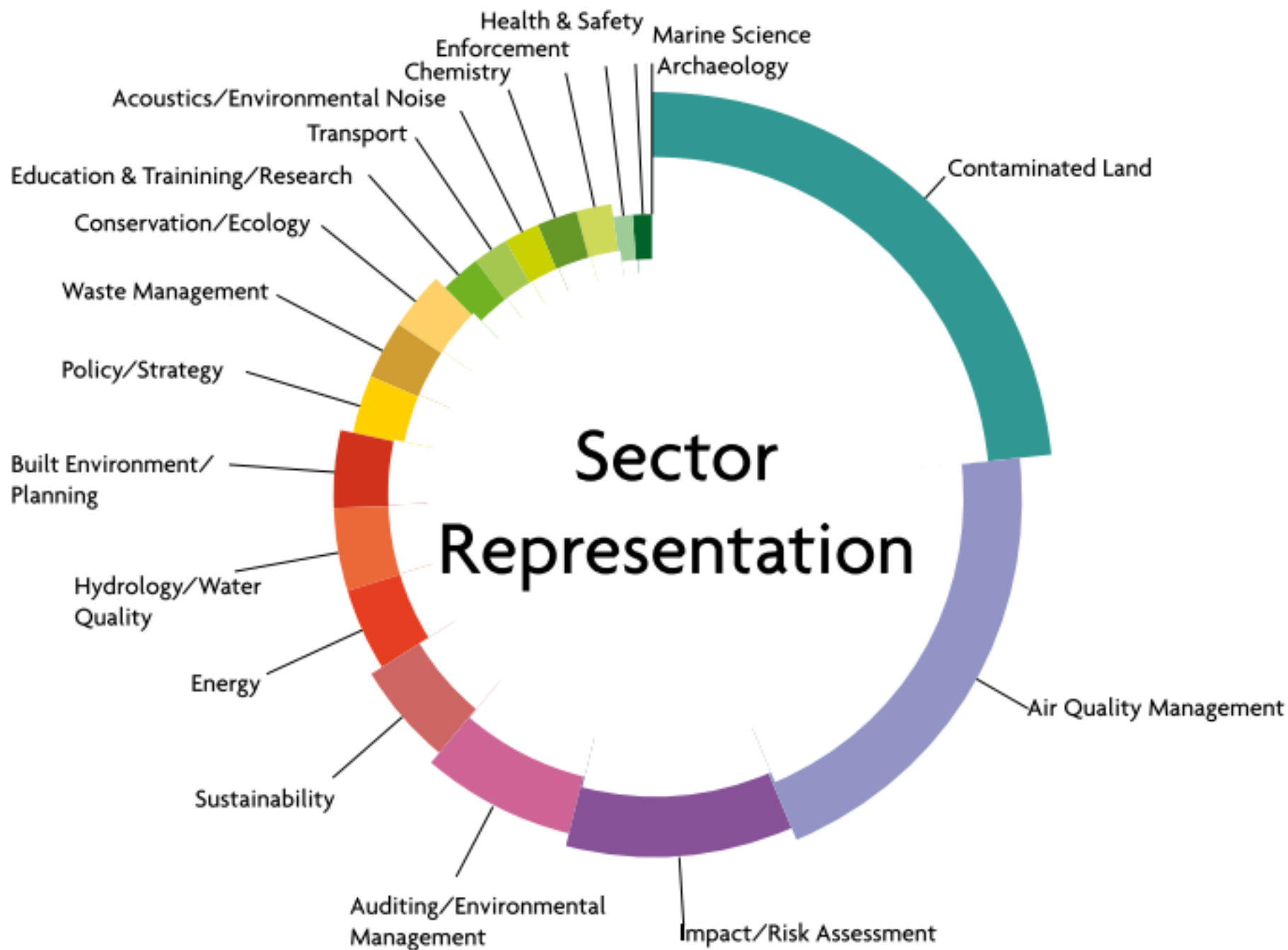
Our sector-leading publication helps our members to learn about and disseminate the latest environmental thinking.

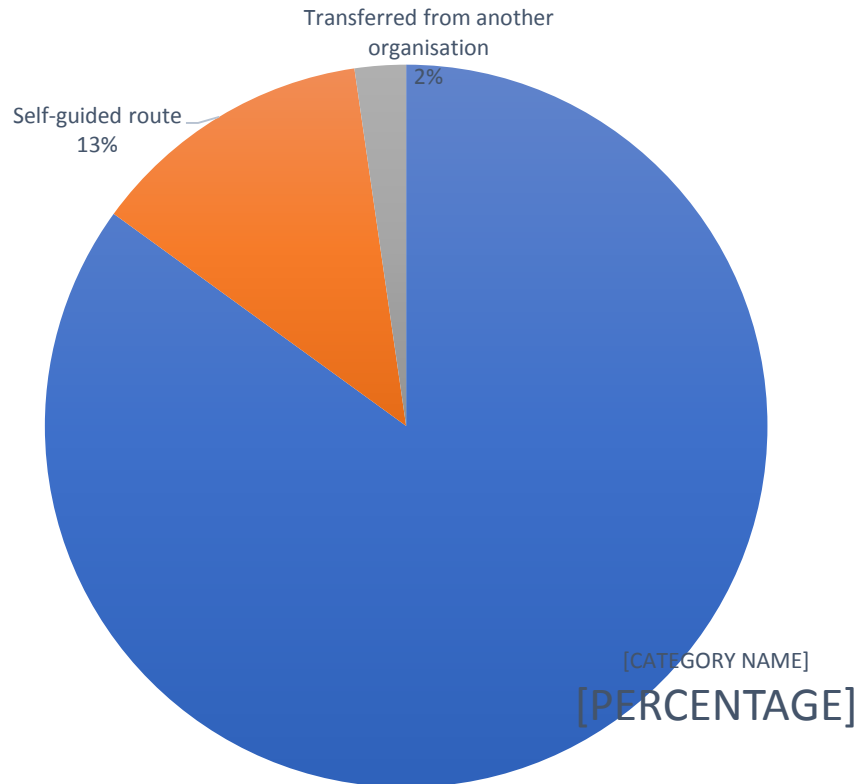
